### The Song <sup>1</sup>

- Performed / recorded by Australian country musician Keith Urban
- 3rd single release from Urban's album *Keith Urban*
- Urban's first #1 single on *Billboard's* Hot Country Singles & Tracks chart, Feb '01
  - Reached #37 on U.S. *Billboard* Hot 100 chart
- Featured in video, aired on Country Music Television and Great American Country
- When it reached #1 -- marked 1<sup>st</sup> time non-American artists had back-to-back chart-topping songs; replacing "There Is No Arizona" by Jamie O'Neal, another Aussie
- Credits the grace of God for sparing him the trials and problems he sees around him

### The Artist – Keith Urban (1967- ) <sup>2</sup>

- Australian country music singer / songwriter / guitarist born in New Zealand
- Has achieved commercial success primarily in the U.S. and Australia
- Began winning singing contests at age eight
- Moved to U.S. in '92; worked as session guitarist before starting a band, The Ranch
  - Also plays ganjo, bass guitar, mandolin, piano, and bouzouki
- Struggled with cocaine and heroin use
  - Entered rehab centers in Nashville ('98) and in California in ('06)
- His '99 self-titled American debut album, featuring this song, was certified platinum
- On guitar, has backed up such groups as Brooks and Dunn, Charlie Daniels, Garth Brooks, and the Dixie Chicks
- Numerous awards and honors; 8 studio albums; married to Aussie Nicole Kidman
- Other hits include: "Once In A Lifetime" (highest country chart debut in history, entering at #17), "You Look Good In My Shirt", "Making Memories Of Us", "Somebody Like You", "You'll Think Of Me", "Better Life", and "Tonight I Wanna Cry"
