Program 37 – “Crying In The Chapel” © Arthur “Artie” Glenn

The song¹:

- Written by Artie Glenn for his son Darrell who recorded it in 1953 while still in high school, along with Artie's band -- the Rhythm Riders. It went to #6
- A hit for several other artists -- June Valli #4, the Orioles #11, Rex Allen #8, Ella Fitzgerald #15, and Art Lund #23
- Elvis Presley recorded the version featured in today's program in 1960, but it wasn't released until April 1965 – as an “Easter special” single – it went to #3 on the singles chart, the greatest chart success for Presley over a 6-year span. It was later included on Presley's 1967 gospel album, *How Great Thou Art*

The recording artist^{2,3,4}:

What more can be said about Elvis Presley? Let's take a brief look at his spiritual side...

- Gospel music was one of the greatest influences in his music and in his soul, thanks to the many all-night gospel sing-ins he attended as a Memphis teenager
- During breaks at recording sessions or after concerts, Presley often joined in private with others for informal gospel music sessions
 - “Gospel pervaded Elvis' character and was a defining and enduring influence all of his days” – from interview in Rolling Stone magazine²
- Family lived just above the poverty line and attended the First Assembly of God Church (in Memphis TN), and its Pentecostal services always included singing
- 1st gospel release was “(There'll Be) Peace in the Valley (for Me)”; It hit #25 in 1957
- Recorded 2 gospel albums: *His Hand in Mine* (1960) and *How Great Thou Art* (1966)
- Despite a commanding stage presence, “...Presley was plagued by self-doubt, poor management, and a basic dissatisfaction with his life”⁴

You saw me crying in the chapel.
The tears I shed were tears of joy
I know the meaning of contentment
Now I am happy with the Lord

This stanza seems to describe a spiritual conversion
Do you have to be in a chapel or church building to find God?

- Saul found Him on the road to Damascus (Acts 9)
- Peter preached “open-air” to a crowd after Pentecost and 3,000 were converted (Acts 2:14-30)
- Philip witnessed to an Ethiopian eunuch who received Christ while in a chariot (Acts 8:26-40)
- “I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through him who gives me strength” -- Philippians 4:12-13

Final thoughts:

The first sermon I ever preached was in a small country chapel. It was built and flourished during an era when the folks who attended were primarily farmers, and this was an essential part of their spiritual and social life. Today, many things about our world have changed, but one thing has not – no matter where we as Christians are, we are His temple – He lives in us. While it's nice to have a favorite place to worship and pray, we need not wait or rely upon any specific tradition, practice, ritual or building to find or communicate with God. The essence of our faith and Christian hope is a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ. That doesn't change!
